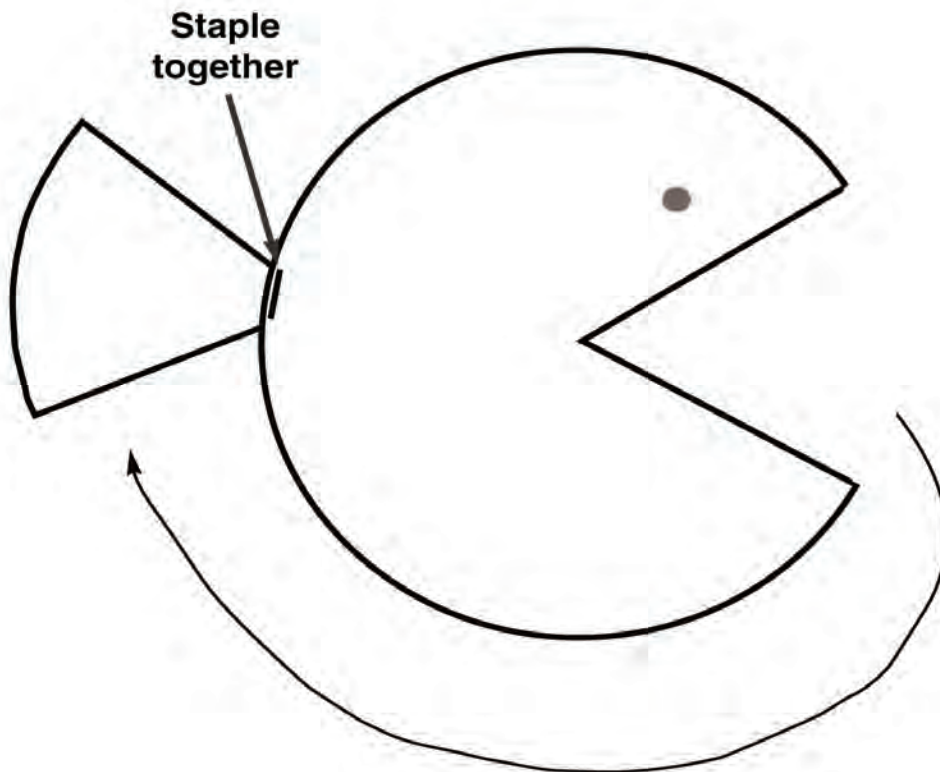
Paper Plate Fish

Needed:

Paper plate, scissors, stapler, colored markers, magnet, glue stick

Instructions:

Cut a wedge-shaped piece out of the paper plate and staple it on as a tail. Ask children to decorate the fish with brightly colored markers. Glue the paper plate hunger message to the front of the fish. Glue a magnet on the back and send home with children. Fish may be placed on refrigerators at home to remind the family of the issue of hunger.
